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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

FOURTH EDITION OF THE BUSINESS GROWTH STRATEGY

2025-2027

The fourth edition of the Business Growth Strategy for Waukesha County will serve as a strategic guide for the Waukesha County Center for Growth Board and staff over the next three years. Operational plans and tactical strategies have been developed to align the organization's collective efforts, along with those of its partners, around common goals.

Using demographic, economic, and labor market analysis, as well as input from the Center for Growth's Board of Directors and key municipal investors, three strategic outcomes have been reaffirmed as vital to the success of the Center for Growth and Waukesha County businesses:

- 1. Business Retention, Expansion, and Attraction
- 2. Expansion of the GROW Fund
- 3. Serving as the Economic Development Resource for Partner Communities

Key performance indicators (KPIs) have been established for each strategic outcome to enable the board and staff to track progress and refine strategies as needed. Annual targets for each KPI will be set by the Center for Growth, with results presented in a quarterly dashboard format. Comprehensive results will be shared publicly in the Center for Growth's annual reports.

A data-driven analysis has also identified a new target industry: Medical Technology. This sector will now join the existing industry clusters of Energy, Power & Controls, Advanced Manufacturing, and Food & Beverage Production as a focus for business retention and attraction efforts. The U.S. Economic Development Administration's recognition of the Madison-to-Milwaukee corridor as a Biohealth Tech Hub further underscores the importance of Medical Technology, highlighting Waukesha County's role in the medical device and healthcare support supply chain.

PLANNING OVERVIEW AND PROCESS

In September 2024, a three-month planning process began, incorporating extensive data and research from the Southeastern Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission and input from key stakeholders. The Center for Growth Board of Directors and municipal investors analyzed the findings, refined strategic outcomes, and contributed to plans for implementing these outcomes over the next three years.

This collaborative effort culminated in the 4th Edition of the Business Growth Strategy for Waukesha County (2025–2027), which was reviewed and approved by the Center for Growth Board of Directors on February 14, 2025.








WAUKESHA COUNTY BY THE NUMBERS




EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT

DRIVER INDUSTRIES

Driver industries are those that play a key role in the economic vitality of a region by supplying quality, often high-paying jobs while also supporting job growth in other industries. These industries function as the primary engines for economic growth and stability because they export products and services and import vital dollars. Those dollars then circulate in the economy and support other local industries and jobs.



Advanced Manufacturing is in our DNA,18% of Wisconsin's workforce is employed in manufacturing. The industry here is robust and diverse, including machinery manufacturing, transportation equipment, fabricated metal products, aerospace and defense. Waukesha County based companies are constantly innovating to be more efficient and effective in their production using advanced analytics, connectivity, automation, and smart manufacturing technologies to embrace the future of production. ENERGY, POWER & CONTROLS

Known as the Smart Energy Hub, this cluster includes world-class energy efficiency, renewable energy, distributed generation, control technologies, energy storage companies and university research. Waukesha County is home to several companies specializing in power, distribution and specialty transformer manufacturing, capacitor, coil and inductor manufacturing, motor and generator manufacturing, relay and industrial control manufacturing.



Wisconsin's strong agricultural base is a historic driver of the robust food and beverage manufacturing cluster in Waukesha County. Internationally recognized brands of kefir, cheese, beer, condiments, spices and food additives are produced here. Local companies also make packaging, labels, pumps, refrigeration units and other products serving the Food & Beverage Processing supply chain.

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Led by our partners BioForward Wisconsin, the Madison and Milwaukee-Waukesha MSA has been designated as the Wisconsin Biohealth Tech Hub and received a \$49 M grant from the US Economic Development Administration. The Biohealth Tech Hub aims to position Wisconsin as a global leader in personalized medicine by strenghthening innovation in manufacturing and commercialization in the region in three key areas: imaging/ theragnostics, genomics, and big data/analytics.

STRATEGIC PLAN GOALS AND STRATEGY

Establishing clear goals and strategic objectives allows an organization to operationalize its mission. Each of the following goals provides measurable objectives by which WCCG will focus strategic activities that support our mission and overarching vision.

GOAL ONE: FOSTER ECONOMIC GROWTH

Foster growth and sustainability with existing Waukesha County businesses while attracting strategic businesses to bolster the county's economic prosperity.

- Assist companies seeking to locate in Waukesha County and support the business attraction efforts of state and local partners. Promote Waukesha County as the premier place to locate.
- Increase awareness of the Waukesha County Center for Growth with key stakeholders in the business community.

In economic development, a **PRIMARY EMPLOYER** is a business producing goods and services for statewide, national or international markets. The goods and services are exported to consumers outside of the region, resulting in a stream of new dollars coming into the local economy and ultimately a distribution of wealth through wages paid to employees, a stronger supply chain, and tax revenues.

Quad Graphics, for example, is headquartered in Waukesha County and provides services to customers all over the country.

Secondary employers are those businesses the produce goods and services that meet the needs of the local consumer market. This includes local restaurants and retail establishments. The relationship between primary and non-primary employers is one of dependence as primary employers are known to bring new wealth and jobs into a region while secondary or local establishments circulate that wealth throughout the economy.

WCCG's economic development efforts focus on attracting, retaining, and nurturing primary employers in our region. These businesses are responsible for significant job creation, provide competitive wages, and often have a larger multiplier effect in terms of economic impact.



GOAL TWO: BUILD THE GROW FUND


The Waukesha County Center for Growth will promote the use of and increase investment in the GROW Fund to a level that will allow the GROW Fund to be a sustainable funding source for WCCG.

KEY PERFORMANCE INDICATORS:

- The number of new loans to Waukesha County employers
- The number of new investors and amount of new investment into the GROW Fund
- Market the GROW Fund to financial partners, strategic partners and potential end users as a tool to retain, expand and attract businesses.
- Identify and secure additional GROW Fund investments from foundations, lenders, organizations, corporations and individuals.

The **GROW Fund** targets two types of applicants essential to the economic development of the County:

- Manufacturing, service and other businesses located (or which will locate) in Waukesha County looking to expand operations and create jobs.
- Developers with projects to make available housing stock to meet existing and projected workforce growth and talent attraction in Waukesha County.



GOAL THREE: BUILD LOCAL ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CAPACITY

The Waukesha County Center for Growth will build capacity in investor communities as the county-wide economic development resource, creating strong partnerships between local government, businesses, and non-profit organizations.

KEY PERFORMANCE INDICATORS:


- The number of projects, new jobs and new capital investment created in Waukesha County

- Act as a forum for sharing best practices and economic development resources for the communities. Leverage partnerships with other agencies to access tools and expertise.


An **ASSIST** is a value-added connection or referral. Think of a hockey assist where a player who passes the puck to the player who scores the goal receives an assist. An example might be a referral to the WMEP for assistance with plant floor layout that enables a company to continue to grow on-site.
